Fleet Foxes frontman **ROBIN PECKNOLD** likes to make the most of his time on tour. On a typical day, he'll wake at 9 a.m., grab a cup of coffee at a local spot and then take his bicycle on a one-hour spin around the city he's visiting. This means that Pecknold, 31, is getting in a lot of mileage on Fleet Foxes' six-month world tour in support of the band's new album, *Crack-Up*. The record's name is a nod to *The Crack-Up*, a collection of essays and letters written by F. Scott Fitzgerald that address nostalgia and the decline of fame. When asked how he weathers being on the road for six straight months, Pecknold fittingly channels his inner Fitzgerald. "I am thinking of time less as a linear thing and more as a series of different states," he says. — MATT McCUE
