## ROBIN PECKNOLD ON PIKE STREET IN SEATTLE



Fleet Foxes frontman **ROBIN PECKNOLD** likes to make the most of his time on tour. On a typical day, he'll wake at 9 a.m., grab a cup of coffee at a local spot and then take his bicycle on a one-hour spin around the city he's visiting. This means that Pecknold, 31, is getting in a lot of mileage on Fleet Foxes' six-month world tour in support of the band's new album, *Crack-Up*. The record's name is

a nod to *The Crack-Up*, a collection of essays and letters written by F. Scott Fitzgerald that address nostalgia and the decline of fame. When asked how he weathers being on the road for six straight months, Pecknold fittingly channels his inner Fitzgerald. "I am thinking of time less as a linear thing and more as a series of different states," he says. — **MATT McCUE**

**Bimbos Cantina**  
 "I worked there while writing the songs for our first album. Everyone else who worked there was a musician from seminal Seattle bands like Band of Horses and Modest Mouse."

**Wall of Sound**  
 This 27-year-old music shop has endured in the age of streaming because it stocks stuff that's hard to find. "This is by far the most adventurous, most selective record store in Seattle."

**Elliott Bay Book Company**  
 Housed in a former Ford truck repair center, this bookstore is home to more than 150,000 titles. "It has a great selection of magazines and books—and coffee."

**Fleet Feet Sports**  
 "This is a store for runners. My bandmate Morgan [Henderson] is an ultramarathoner; he meets up with the owners to go on runs together. Plus, we share half our band name with them."
