What was old is new again in Portugal's capital.

LISBON HAS SEEN a renaissance in recent years, with underutilized buildings reimagined as outposts for dining, shopping and sleeping.

STAY Rooms at AlmaLusa may run a little narrow—in the 16th century, they housed guns for small ships—but they make up for it in details: original ceramic tiles, Castelbel bath products and balconies overlooking Municipio Square.

EAT Many cities have food halls, but Lisbon's Mercado da Ribeira has been at it since 1892. Do as the locals do and shop the produce stalls before grabbing lunch in the food court.

SHOP A Vida Portuguesa is a must-stop shop stocked with made-in-Portugal goodies such as leather clogs and colorful tins of sardines—perfect non-traditional souvenirs to bring home. — ELIZABETH DOYLE
